Hello Leisure Marchers and welcome to the final newsletter for the 2018 North Island Leisure Marching event. We have been flat out crossing T's and dotting I's in the lead up to the weekend and we hope you have as much fun during the weekend, as we have had organizing it.

Parking

We have been very fortunate to be given permission to use the netball courts next door to the stadium for parking on the Saturday. The entrance is on Taine Street and is the driveway just past the stadium from the High Street end. Please take care while driving in the court area as we are liable for any damage.

There will be marshals on duty to assist you from 7.30am until 8.45am. After this time the gates will be locked so your vehicles will be secure. However, if you are planning to leave the stadium before the end of the day, please DO NOT park in the courts.

Please also be aware that parking in the time restricted parks by the shops is not advised, as the parking wardens are extremely vigilant in this area.

General:

- * The entrance to the Walter Nash Centre is in Taine St, (NOT Tocker Street as publicized in some places)
- * There is a café on site which sells hot and cold food and drinks.
- * Tables and chairs will be set up in the meeting room which will become a "pop up" café and sell food and "fancy" coffees in there as well.
- * Self-serve instant tea and coffee will also be available in the meeting room.
- * Raffles and additional souvenirs may be purchased from the stall to the right of the entry doors in the main stadium.
- * If you wish you can bring a chilly bin of your "Night Function refreshments" to the venue on the Saturday morning. Please clearly label it with your team name and remember to place slicker pads inside to keep your drinks nice and cold. We will keep it under lock and key for the day and then place it at your table ready for your arrival.
- * When you bring your drinks into the venue, whether in the morning or in the evening, please be discreet.
- * Don't forget there is a prize for the "best dressed table" at the function.
- * The function is BYO and it would be appreciated if you could take your empties home with you.

Points of Courtesy

It is courteous:

- to keep movement around the grandstands to a minimum while a team is performing their display
- to stay for the entire day and appreciate the effort ALL teams have put in to practicing and perfecting their plans
- to acknowledge the complexity of a teams movements by applauding where appropriate
- to keep your march past to no more than 10 beats
- to ensure your plans do not exceed 5 minutes (600 beats)

- 4.15pm Delegates meeting in the large meeting room
 - Goody bags available for pick up
 - Please consider if you would like to host the 2020 North Islands
- 5.00pm Stadium closes

Saturday 29th September 2018

- 7.45am Stadium doors open (they will not be open before this time)
- 8.35am Leaders report to "muster area" on court 3 (behind the curtain at rear of stadium)
- 8.45am Teams join their leaders in the muster area in single file
- 9.00am Marchpast. You can be as fancy as you wish, but please keep it to a maximum of 10 beats
- 9.30am Opening Ceremony
- 9.50am 1st team to start disc (No lunch break)
- 2.15pm All teams assemble on court in single file for:
 - Flag Handover to Taupo Cosmopolitans North Islands Hosts 2019
 - Serpentine
 - Raffle Draw
 - Close
- 7.00pm to 11.00pm − BYO Moonshine to the Hoe Down in the "Wild Wild West"
